# Using conjunctions

You use conjunctions in order to make your sentences longer.

“**Weil**” and “**da**” are subordinating conjunctions which means that the verb will need to go to the end.

Ich fahre nach Deutschland, weil ich das Land und die Kultur liebe.

“weil” is so vile,  
it makes the  
verb run a mile!

↑  
*subordinating  
conjunction*

*verb*
