

The InterACT is a project, run by the Citizenship Foundation, successfully brings communities together.

InterACT brings together 16-25 year old asylum seekers and refugees with local young people to tackle issues they care about. The project enhances community spirit by building partnerships, challenging misconceptions and developing common understanding among participants.

InterACT works in five cities every year. In each city, they recruit two partner organisations, one that works with asylum seekers and refugees and one that works with local young people. The partnership working model brings together organisations who may not otherwise have worked together.

InterACT's participants have the opportunity to work with people they may otherwise not have met. For example, in Birmingham, young people identified that there are not enough opportunities for them to interact and mix with those from different cultural backgrounds so they developed a drama to campaign for more multicultural youth provision.
