Numbers in the '20s' to '90s'

Remember: in German we say the **smaller number** first and the **larger number** second.

thirty-**three**

dreiund**drei**ßig

seventy-**eight**

achtund**sieb**zig

How does this differ from English?



Numbers in the '100s and '1000s'

These work in the same way as English except that **you don't need** to say **'one'** for 100 or 1,000.

1,500

tausendfünfhundert



Dates in the '19s' to '20s'

For years beginning with **'19'** in German we say 'neunzehnhundert'. But for years beginning with **'20'**, in German we say 'zweitausend'

1996 **neunzehnhundert**sechsendneunzig

2020 **zweitausend**zwanzig



Dates

For ordinal numbers we add **'ten'** for the numbers 4-19, but from 20th onwards we add **'sten'**

on 4th March

am vier**ten** März

on 25th July

am fünfundzwanzig**sten** Juli

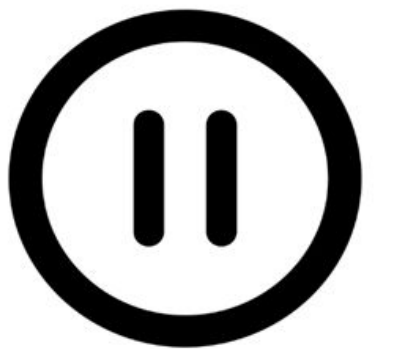

Large numbers and dates:



1. Numbers 13-19 add **-zehn**
2. Most numbers 20-90 add **-zig**
3. When saying and writing numbers 20s-90s in German the smaller number comes first
4. To say one hundred in German we say **hundert**
5. To say years starting with '19' we say **neunzehnhundert**
6. For years starting with 20- we say **zweitausend**
