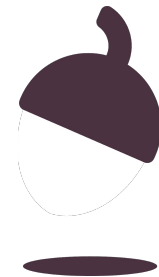

Je visite	I visit
Je loge	I stay
Je me promène	I walk
Je me baigne	I bathe
Je me repose	I relax
au bord de la mer	to/at the seaside
(à) la campagne	(to/in) the countryside
(à) la montagne	(to/in) the mountains
(à) la mer	(to/at) the sea
(à) la plage	(to/at) the beach





Verbs with 'I' in the present tense.

1. ER verbs end in 'e' when using the 'I' form
2. Reflexive verbs use an extra pronoun 'me'

Je vais	I go
Je visite	I visit
Je loge	I stay
Je me promène	I walk
Je me baigne	I bathe
Je me repose	I relax



Reflexive vs non reflexive verbs in the 'I' form in the present tense



ER verbs end in [e] when using the 'I' form. The [e] is silent.

Je vais I go

Je visite I visit

Je loge I stay

Je **me** promène I walk

Je **me** baigne I bathe

Je **me** repose I relax

Reflexive verbs have an additional reflexive pronoun **'me'** between the subject and the verb.
