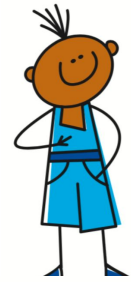

To form the present tense with a regular ER verb, remove the ER from the infinitive and add the correct ending.

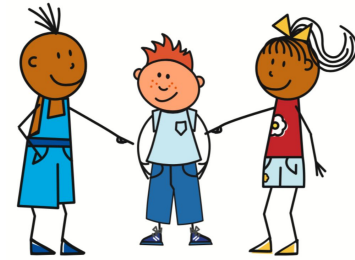
Rigoler - To laugh



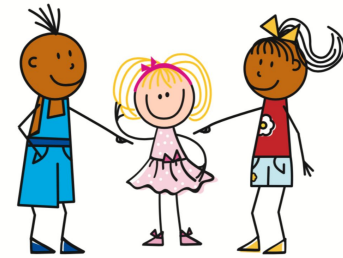
Je rigole - I laugh



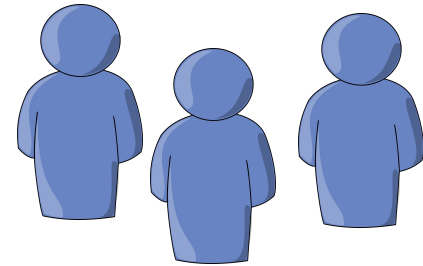
Tu rigoles - You laugh



Il rigole - He laughs



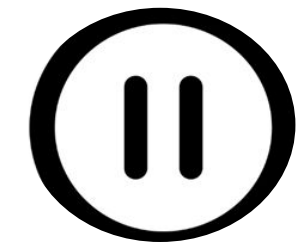
Elle rigole - She laughs
