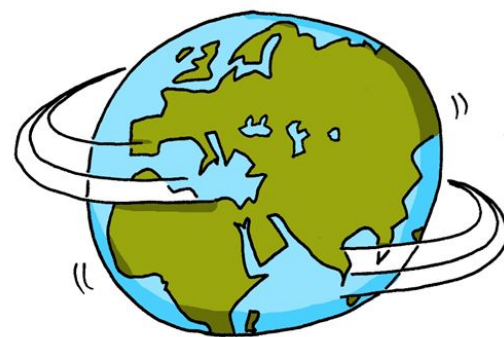

The conditional



The conditional is used to say what you would/could/should do. It allows you to express your hopes and dreams.

Today we will be looking at **2 structures** which both mean **would like** and both need an **infinitive** at the **END** of the sentence.

Ich **möchte** Obst als
Nachspeise **haben**

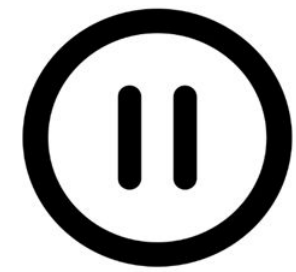
I would like to have
fruit as dessert

Ich **würde gern** ins
Restaurant **gehen**

I would like to go
to the restaurant

Can you figure out which words mean 'would like'? What are the infinitives?





Just a reminder....

Infinitives end in **en**, this is how you would find the word in the dictionary.

For example:

kaufen - to buy

essen - to eat

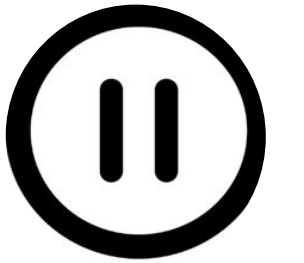
Can you think of any other infinitives for the topic area of food?



Conditional structures:

1. How do you say would like? (x2) möchte / würde gern
2. Is there any difference between the 2 ways of saying I would like? No, they both mean would like
3. What has to go to the end of the sentence? infinitive
4. How do infinitives end? en
5. How do you say he would like to buy fruit?
