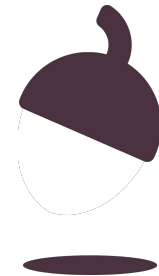

## Liaison:

The final sound of one word is carried over to the start of the next. This normally happens when a silent consonant is followed by a vowel.

travailler	To work
aider	To help
donner de confiance	To give confidence
développer de nouvelles compétences	To develop new skills
participer à la vie en société	To participate in society
rencontrer de nouvelles personnes	To meet new people
les sans-abri / les SDF	homeless people
les enfants	children
enrichissant	enriching



The infinitive can also be translated by the gerund.

**Travailler** =  
**to** work AND  
working



Use any of these structures to express an intended future action:

'I would like'



**followed by the infinitive**  
**(Ends in ER / IR / RE)**

**Je voudrais faire** du  
bénévolat

**J'aimerais faire** du bénévolat

**J'ai l'intention de faire** du  
bénévolat  
= I intend to do some volunteering

**J'ai envie de faire** du bénévolat

= I have a desire to do some volunteering  
= I want to volunteer / I feel like volunteering
