Nominative	<i>ego</i>	I	<i>tu</i>	you (s)
Accusative	<i>me</i>	me	<i>te</i>	you (s)
Ablative	<i>me(cum)</i>	(with) me	<i>te(cum)</i>	(with) you (s)
Nominative	<i>nos</i>	we	<i>vos</i>	you (pl)
Accusative	<i>nos</i>	us	<i>vos</i>	you (pl)
Ablative	<i>nobis(cum)</i>	(with) us	<i>vobis(cum)</i>	(with) you (pl)
